LEARNING DIARY

DATE: 21.10.2024

The SAFE workshop kicked off with a gathering in the designated classroom, where professors exchanged warm greetings, and students gradually found their seats, surrounded by unfamiliar faces. Following a round of introductions, we embarked on a group walk through Granada's charming narrow streets, led by our Spanish professor. Originally built as a fortress in 889 AD and later converted into a royal palace by the Nasrid dynasty in the 13th century, the Alhambra showcases intricate Islamic art, expansive gardens, and stunning views over the city. We were guided through its ancient palaces, courtyards, and towers, where we learned about its unique blend of Moorish and Christian architecture, reflecting Granada's complex history of cultural influences. This immersive tour deepened our appreciation for Granada's heritage and left us eager to delve into our workshop activities the following day.
